Responsibility

We are currently at a point in time where humans have an impact on almost everything on earth: the Anthropocene era. Humans not only form part of nature, they also shape nature to a large extent. Hardly any unspoilt nature remains these days, as nature is influenced by humanity all over the world to a greater or lesser extent. From climate change – caused by humans – to deforestation and the loss of habitat, humanity has left traces everywhere. Whereas twenty years ago, there was still a clear contrast between 'the wild' and 'the zoo', the two have increasingly started to come together.

As a result of this shift, zoos can and must play a new role. ARTIS wishes to lead the way in this change. We aim to offer a place where animals are close at hand and where people can experience nature. At the same time, we also want this to be a place where the relationship between humans and nature can be discussed. We *are* nature. ARTIS helps us to see this.

Playful

The conservation of nature, humanity and the planet must be ensured. At ARTIS, we want to take our share of the responsibility. We can achieve this goal by attracting a wide audience and engaging our visitors with our mission and vision in a playful way. To do so, we mainly offer action perspectives, ensuring that our visitors become more informed, gain insights and are in a better position to understand their own contribution. As a result, ARTIS wishes to play an increasingly important role in the social debate on nature issues. To this end, we are directing our gaze outwards. ARTIS will be expanding its programmes to include external partners with similar aims, both at home and abroad. In this way, we wish to become a forum which connects various parties. This aim will be our focus in the years ahead.
